




Can't stop drinking?



The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

If you felt like I felt when I drank, you'd do it too.

For me, drinking was the missing ingredient for awhile. Alcohol has often been referred to as the social lubricant. My Uncle calls booze Aiming Fluid when he's on the Golf Course. Meeting your partner's parents for the first time might be easier with the help of some liquid courage. Hearing this truth at a meeting last week took me back to why I drank the way I did. A false sense of self-protection and ease around others were the main reasons why I drank. Additionally, trying hard to be anyone but me is beyond exhausting. Liquor gave me the energy to keep playing the role. As I have mentioned before, alcohol was my salvation, not my problem. I am grateful and humbled that Alcoholics Anonymous gave me the strength and guidance required to clean up my side of the street and grow up.

2. Staying connected is what keeps my ego right-sized.

When it comes to Steps 4 and 5, one word comes to mind: CONFESSION. Being raised Catholic, this word used to fill me with fear, but after I completed the 12 Steps for the first time, I actually developed an addiction to spilling my guts to my Sponsor. I take zero credit for the fact that when I start getting sloppy, I make the phone call and confess everything, and then shut up to hear what is suggested. Tell people what is going on between your ears. The cornerstone is confession because honesty is an on-going practice that pays huge dividends. Keep an eye on your ego. Left unattended, it will eventually try to take back control.

3. My "ism" isn't just about drinking---it's about how I do life.

If you're new and about to read this part, I hope and pray that it does not deter you from staying in the program. At some point in your journey, you may discover that drinking isn't really your problem. Heroin is not your problem. Shopping, gambling, nicotine, spending, and anything else that help you escape life on life's terms are not the disease. Some people seem to naturally know how to do life. Most of us alcoholics do not naturally know how to do life well, which may explain why addiction happens to be a significant part of our story. In the beginning, working the steps with a Sponsor will get you free from drinking. After that, the real work begins to free you from yourself. If you keep going and do the work inside A.A., the stuff outside goes a lot smoother.

I hope this helps and I'll see you at a meeting.






